Southend Bach Choir began life in 1943 as an evening class of the Municipal College in Southend under the direction of its founder Dr Harold May, FRCO. Known as the Municipal College Choir it gave its first performance in December 1943 in a programme that consisted of selections from Handel's Messiah. As the Municipal College Choral Society the choir became well known, singing major works in Southend and further afield. In 1968 the choir became the Southend Bach Choir, and in 1993, under the direction of Gerald Bates, celebrated its Golden Jubilee with a memorable performance of Bach's Mass in B Minor. In 2001 the Choir welcomed its present Musical Director Colin Edwards, as he returned to his home town after many years in the North West. The choir performs a number of concerts each year in many venues in and around Essex, including a popular Christmas concert. Recent concerts have included The Concert for Remembrance - The Armed Man; Crucifixion; Rejoice - English Choral Music by Rutter, Britten, Vaughan Williams & Tippett; Made in Britain – music by John Rutter, Bob Chilcott, Andrew Lloyd Webber and the Beatles; Rossini's Petite Messe Solennelle; An Evening of Gilbert & Sullivan; Mozart's Trinitatis Mass; Haydn's Creation Mass. The choir values its work in the community and regularly takes its music to sheltered housing and homes within the Southend area and also supports local charities. This year the choir are very pleased and proud to be taking part in the BBC Essex Radio Carol Concert.

We are pleased to welcome the Essex Concert Orchestra and the following soloists to our concert this evening.

Alison Langer (Soprano) is currently singing with Glyndebourne, working on their Tour productions after singing in this years festival. Alison graduated from the GSMD opera course this year, under the tutelage of David Pollard. Alison made her professional debut as Lisette in La Rondine Puccini last summer with Dublin Company Opera in the Open. Roles include Erodiade San Giovanni Battista Stradella (Guildhall), Ida/Rosalinde (cover), Die Fledermaus Strauss (Clonter Opera). In Opera scenes, Juliette Gounod, Lucia Donizetti, Fiordiligi Mozart, Female Chorus Britten. In Opera performance, Countess The Cunning Peasant Dvorak (Guildhall), Norina I pazzi per Progetto Donizetti (Guildhall). Alison will be performing a solo recital at St Martin in the Fields on Tuesday 8th December as well as performing in Don Pasquale - Donizetti and Saul - Handel with Glyndebourne Touring Opera.

Bethan Langford (*Mezzo Soprano*) studies on the Opera Course at the Guildhall School, where she has been awarded the Susan Longfield prize and Paul Hamburger lieder prize. She is a Samling Artist, a Les Azuriales Young Artist, and as the winner of the Concordia Founders' Prize gave her debut Wigmore Hall recital earlier this year. Bethan is currently preparing for a contemporary opera performance at the Royal Opera House and for the role of Lucretia in Britten's The Rape of Lucretia in Spring 2016 for Guildhall Opera. Bethan's studies are supported by an EMI Music Sound Foundation bursary, a Tutton Award from Help Musicians UK and the Worshipful Company of Skinners. She is looking forward to making her European solo debut at Gaudi's House in Barcelona in April 2016.

Nick Allen (Tenor) graduated from the Guildhall School of Music & Drama in 2011. Last summer he played the roles of Frederic in The Pirates of Penzance and Nanki-Poo in The Mikado in the inaugural UK tour of the Official Gilbert & Sullivan Opera Company. Other roles include 'Tobias' in Jonathan Dove's opera, Tobias and the Angel, and 'Defendant' in G&S' Trial by Jury. He understudied the role of 'Damon' in Acis and Galatea under the late Sir Charles Mackerras at the Jubilee Hall in Aldeburgh. His wide oratorio experience includes tenor solos in Rossini's Petite Messe Solennelle, Handel's Messiah, Mozart's Requiem and Coronation Mass, Haydn's Creation and Nelson Mass, Beethoven's Mass in C Major, Michael Haydn's Missa pro Defunctis, Ramirez's Navidad Nuestra and the Evangelist in Bach's St. John Passion. In 2013 Nick performed Britten's Serenade for Tenor, Horn and Strings as part of the centenary celebrations. Nick attended the seven-week summer opera course held in Banff, Canada, where he made his operatic debut as Peter Quint in the Benjamin Britten opera The Turn of the Screw as part of the annual Banff Summer Arts Festival. Nick has collaborated as a soloist with numerous contemporary composers and performed their new works at venues including the Wigmore Hall and St. John's, Smith Square. In 2011 and 2012 at the Barbican Pit Theatre he played the role of English composer Herbert Howells in A Soldier and a Maker - a play written and directed by Iain Burnside based on the life and music of Ivor Gurney. Nick was also part of the radio version of the play for BBC Radio 3.

Piran Legg (Baritone) was born in Kent and graduated as a baritone from the Guildhall Opera School in the summer of 2014. Since then he has begun his studies on the Artist's Diploma with Kate Paterson. He made his operatic debut at the Wexford Festival singing chorus and small roles and has previously performed in 2012 at Garsington, as cover Alcandro in Vivaldi's L'Olimpiade and The Guide, Boy on boat and Polish Father in Britten's Death in Venice in the summer of 2015. In addition to this Piran, whilst working as a Garsington Young Artist, understudied the role of the Notary in Strauss's comic romance, Intermezzo. Recent highlights include a debut at the Cadogan Hall singing Schaunard in La Boheme, assuming the title mantle of a crusty old codger with a prosthetic nose in The Cooper by Thomas Arne at the Guildhall School, as well as taking a young artist position at Iford in Monteverdi's The Return of Ulysses with Christian Curnyn. In October Piran made a return to Cadogan Hall singing the role of Danieli in Wagner's Das Liebesverbot with Chelsea Opera Group. A busy concert schedule is planned over the coming months, with performances of Handel's Messiah around the U.K. and a performance of the Bach Christmas Oratorio on the 23rd of December. Piran was an International Opera Awards bursary winner 2014 – 2015 and is grateful for the financial support of The Worshipful Company of Fishmongers and Serena Fenwick.
