The Southend Bach Choir

Musical Director - Colin Edwards

The Southend Bach Choir began life in 1943 as an evening class of the Municipal College in Southend under the direction of its founder Dr. Harold May, FRCO. Known as the Municipal College Choir it gave its first performance in December of that year. The programme consisted of selections from Handel's Messiah.

In its early years the Municipal College Choral and Orchestral Society sponsored the birth of the College Opera Group, which became independent in 1950. In this year the choir's name reverted to "The Municipal College Choral Society" and many challenging concerts followed.

In 1968 the choir became the Southend Bach Choir, and in 1993 under the baton of Gerald Bates, (Musical Director 1987-2001) the Choir celebrated its Golden Jubilee with a memorable performance of Bach's B Minor Mass. Upon Gerry's retirement in 2001 the choir welcomed its present Musical Director Colin Edwards.

The choir has just started its 80th year and will be celebrating its 80th anniversary in 2023.

The Southend Bach Choir is a very happy and friendly group of people singing a wide range of music. We meet for rehearsal every Tuesday evening in school term time at:

Rehearsals commence at 7.30pm with a break for coffee and conversation and finish at 9.30pm. Each week we receive professional training from our Musical Director, learning new works and preparing for our performances.

Our Guest Soloists

Hannah Wardrop (*Soprano*) - is a young Soprano currently in her third year at Trinity Laban Conservatoire of Music and Dance, studying Voice with Joan Rodgers CBE.

Hannah spent her youth studying in West Sussex, around which she performed in several local concerts for her peers and the community.

Her budding dramatic coloratura Soprano voice has already earned her many performance opportunities within Trinity and externally, including playing the title role in Trinity's recent summer production of 'Strozzi!', written by Head of Department, Jennifer Hamilton. Previous to this she has avidly taken part in smaller Opera Scenes performances, portraying Madame Larina in a scene of Tchaikovsky's Eugene Onegin and singing in the chorus of Donizetti's Anna Bolena.

Current projects involve chorus for Trinity's upcoming Winter Opera Scenes, and various festive concerts in and around London.

Following her Bachelor's degree at Trinity, she hopes to pursue postgraduate studies, still in London, and get a place on a young artist's program, which will hopefully launch her into the Opera world.

Hester Dart (Mezzo Soprano) - is a London based mezzo currently studying on the MMus programme at Trinity Laban, under the tutelage of Neil Baker and Robert Bottriel. Hester's interest lies in early and contemporary repertoire. They made their debut on the alternative opera stage at the 2019 Grimeborn Festival, in Verity Lane's The Crane. In January 2022 they created the role of 'Elem' in Edward Jessen's sonic theatre work, Syllable. At Trinity Laban, they have taken on roles in Strozzi! (a jukebox opera celebrating the work of Barbara Strozzi), King Arthur (Purcell) and The Ghosts of Versailles (Corigliano). Alongside their solo work, Hester is a cofounder of new music collective, The Ruffians.

Sholto Biscoe-Taylor (*Tenor*) - began studying with Dominic Natoli when he was 18 which led to him taking an interest in further musical education. Sholto was offered a scholarship to study with Dominic at Trinity Laban and he is now in his final year.

After receiving his place at Trinity Laban Sholto moved to Berlin for a year to study under Scot Weir, a Professor at Hanns Eisler conservatoire. During his time in Berlin he sang as a soloist and chorister for several choirs including the "Junges Consortium Berlin" with whom he performed at the Marktoberdorf Chamber Music Competition.

Sholto represented Trinity Laban in the Junior Ferrier competition, performed two principal roles for the post graduate opera scenes, and three principal roles in their full opera productions.

Johannes Gerges (Bass) - is a 22-year-old bass studying for an MMus in vocal performance at Trinity Laban Conservatoire of Music and Dance where he is a Kathleen Roberts scholar, under the tutelage of Robert Alderson. During his time at Trinity, Johannes has performed scenes from Peter Grimes, Billy Budd, Menotti's Amahl and the Night Visitors, Lucia di Lammermoor, Anna Bolena and La Clemenza di Tito. This term Johannes will perform the role of Scrooge in Musgrave's A Christmas Carol and Stromminger in La Wally in the vocal department's opera scenes. He also performed the role of Fra Domenico in the premiere production of Jennifer Hamilton's jukebox opera Strozzi in July 2022, a work celebrating the life and work of the early baroque Venetian composer Barbara Strozzi. More recently, Johannes performed Fra Domenico as well as the role of Antonio Bosso in an October production of Strozzi in Norfolk with the Yorke Trust. This month, Johannes will perform as a professional soloist in the Fauré Requiem, Haydn Nelson Mass and Howard Goodall's Eternal Light in concerts with the Addison Singers. Johannes is a young artist with the SongEasel programme which aims to promote art song in South East London.

Our Accompanist

Roger Humphrey - studied Organ, Piano, and conducting at the Royal College of Music, where he gained a degree of Bachelor of Music and was awarded his master of Arts degree at City of London University in 1993. He has held positions of Director of Music at Southend School for Boys, and lecturer in Performing Arts at South East Essex College. Roger is conductor of the Southend Choral Society, Director of Music at Holy Trinity Church, Southchurch, and accompanist to the Southend Bach Choir. He is also founder of the Southend Girls Choir, and a Director of the Southend Summer School for Performing Arts. Roger was appointed Director of the Southend Boys Choir in 1996 by the Southend Borough Council. In January 2000 Roger was elected a Fellow of the Royal Society of Arts for services to Music and the Arts.
