The Southend Bach Choir

Musical Director – Roger Humphrey

The Southend Bach Choir began life in 1943 as an evening class of the Municipal College in Southend under the direction of its founder Dr. Harold May, FRCO. Known as the *Municipal College Choir*, it gave its first performance in December of that year. The programme consisted of selections from Handel's "Messiah".

In its early years, the Municipal College Choral and Orchestral Society sponsored the birth of the *College Opera Group*, which became independent in 1950. In this year the choir's name reverted to *The Municipal College Choral Society* and many challenging concerts followed. In 1968, the choir became the *Southend Bach Choir*, and in 1993, under the baton of Gerald Bates (Musical Director 1987-2001), the choir celebrated its Golden Jubilee with a memorable performance of Bach's "Mass in B minor". Upon Gerry's retirement in 2001, the choir welcomed its past Music Director Colin Edwards until 2023.

In 2023, Roger, who had served as our accompanist for 40 years, stepped into the role of Music Director. Under his direction, the *Southend Bach Choir* continues to thrive, building on its rich history and looking forward to many more memorable performances.

This performance of Bach's "Mass in B minor" holds special significance for the choir, as it was a work that our former Music Director, Colin Edwards, had intended to conduct before his passing. In honour of his dedication and passion for this masterpiece, the choir is proud to bring his vision to life and share this extraordinary work with our audience.

Our Guest Soloists

Ella Joy (Soprano) - Ella is a 28-year-old soprano from Essex. During her postgraduate studies at the Royal Northern College of Music she was a Levenshulme Arts Scholar, resident artist at Opera North, commended entry to the Frederic Cox Competition and recipient of awards from the Mbili Trust and the Kathleen Trust. Recent operatic roles include *Baronin von Freimann* in scenes from Lortzing's "Der Wildschütz" at RNCM, Tess, in Winterreise - Schubert's "Tess: A Winter's Tale" with the Curious Opera company, Iphigénie in scenes from Gluck's "Iphigénie en Tauride", Blanche in scenes from Poulenc's "Dialogues des Carmélites", Gretel in scenes from Humperdink's "Hänsel und Gretel" and Zerlina in scenes from Mozart's "Don Giovanni". Ella has collaborated with upcoming artists and directors in London, including Julia Mintzer, Jack Furness and Eleanor Burke. She has played roles at the Tête à Tête Opera Festival, for the DEBUT opera company, UC Opera, KC Opera and the Conservatoire du 12me in Paris. She has performed roles at London venues including the Playground Theatre, the Aldridge Theatre, the Maltings Theatre, the Bloomsbury Theatre and the Stratford Theatre. Ella has performed as a member of the award-winning Lunar Consort and as a chorister for the *Rodolfus Choir*, conducted by Ralph Allwood. She has been a soloist for the UCL Symphony Chorus and for the Chamber Choir of the Sorbonne. She has performed with orchestra with Morley College and in recital with pianist Adam Turner. Since finishing her studies at RNCM, Ella had the privilege of studying with her wonderful teacher, Michael Harper in London, before his passing in March 2025. Michael's wisdom, kindness and body-soul approach to artistry continue to inspire her anytime she sings.

Talia Lieberman (Soprano) - Talia Lieberman is an emerging soprano who began her musical journey in the Southend Girls Choir, where she developed a passion for classical singing from an early age. A recent graduate from the Royal Welsh College of Music and Drama, she has already gained significant experience on the operatic stage. Whilst studying, she performed alongside the David Seligman Opera School in productions such as Humperdink's "Hänsel und Gretel" and the Welsh National Opera's "Opera Gala". Most notably, last spring she made her principal role debut as *II Gatto* in Respighi's "La Bella dormente nel bosco". Over the 2024-2025 season, Talia is taking part in three esteemed young artist programmes. She has been selected for the renowned Genesis Sixteen programme, part of The Sixteen ensemble, which is dedicated to developing young choral singers, and is a new choral scholar for the Oxford Bach Soloists who study and specialise in the music of J.S. Bach. She is also a member of Vox Next Gen, the young artist programme of the professional choir Vox Urbane. All these programmes are shaping her development as an accomplished ensemble singer, providing opportunities to work with leading musicians in the industry. Alongside these achievements, Talia is serving as a choral scholar at *St James's Piccadilly*, where she continues to develop her artistry and passion for choral music.

Helena Paish (Alto) - Helena Paish has been singing in choirs since she was six and at the age of twelve won BBC Young Chorister of the Year 2014. She was a founding girl chorister at Truro Cathedral (2015-2020) where she took part in three CDs and was frequently featured as a soloist live on BBC Radio 3. During her time in Truro, she appeared as a soloist with many local choirs. Helena graduated from Cambridge with a Music degree in 2023 and stayed on for a 4th year with Trinity College Choir as an alto Lay Clerk. She has featured as a soloist on three recordings with Trinity and has toured with them to Germany, France, Italy, and Switzerland. During her studies, Helena was awarded second prize in the Clare College Song Competition, with head judge James Gilchrist and enjoyed taking part in concerts and performing solo recitals across Cambridge. Helena is currently studying for a masters in singing at the Royal Academy of Music. Alongside her studies, she has continued with choral singing as a member of the Choir of the Chapels Royal, HM Tower of London and Continuum Choir. Helena is also an established composer. In 2019 she won the BBC Proms Inspire Competition, which led to her compositional debut at the BBC Proms by the BBC Singers, and a commission by the group. She has gone on to receive commissions from groups including The Choir of St John's College, Cambridge, Multitude of Voyces, The Vasari Singers and Continuum. Her music features on three CDs.

Colin Gilmore *(Tenor)* - Colin found his voice and love for choral singing as a member of the *school choir at Southend High School for Boys* under the direction of Michael Crabb, long time Musical Director of Southend Festival Chorus. It wasn't until 1994 that he rediscovered this passion when he joined *Southend Festival Chorus* and was re-acquainted with both singing and Michael. He went on to become a member of local chamber choir *Gaudeamus* after being invited as a guest singer to tour with them in the USA in 1999 and in 2011 he became a member of *City Chamber Choir* in London, a convenient choice working as he did in the City of London. Colin developed his vocal technique and solo voice under the tutelage of local singing teacher Margaret Cozens and has provided tenor solos for all the choirs with which he sings, in many works, including Handel's "Messiah" and "Dixit Dominus", Mozart's "Requiem" and "Coronation Mass", Bach's "Christmas Oratorio" and "St Matthew Passion", Vaughan-Williams's "Serenade to Music" and "Mass in G Minor", Haydn's "Creation" and "Nelson Mass", Mendelssohn's "Elijah" and singing countertenor in Vivaldi's "Gloria" and Orff's "Carmina Burana". Having moved to Norfolk in 2022, he now sings with

King's Lynn Festival Chorus and *The Guildhall Singers*, and continues to be a member of *Coro 94*, formerly under the baton of the late Michael Kibblewhite.

David Townend (Bass) - David Townend started singing as a chorister at *Holy Trinity Church*, Southchurch, and in the *Southend Boys' Choir*. In 1985, he took a place to read Law at the University of Sheffield and became a Songman of Sheffield Cathedral. He sang with the Cathedral for 20 years. He has studied singing with Richard Hill and Martin Hindmarsh. As a soloist, David's repertoire includes Bach's "St John Passion" and "St Matthew Passion", Britten's "Canticle IV", Delius's "Appalachia", Elgar's "Dream of Gerontius", "King Olaf" and "The Apostles", Handel's "Judas Maccabeus" and "Messiah", Haydn's "Creation", Mendelssohn's "Elijah" and "St Paul", Orff's "Carmina Burana", Puccini's "Messa di Gloria", Rossini's "Petite Messe Solennelle", Schutz's "St Matthew Passion", Tippett's "A Child of Our Time", Vaughan Williams's "Serenade to Music", "Five Mystical Songs" and "The Pilgrim's Progress", and Walton's "Belshazzar's Feast". He particularly enjoys early 20th century English and French songs, and has given many recitals from that repertoire as well as recitals of Schubert's "Die schöne Müllerin".



Our Musical Director

Roger Humphrey - Roger studied organ, piano and conducting at the Royal College of Music, London and University of London. Post graduate work included studies at the City of London University and Guildhall School of Music. He has held positions of Director of Music at Southend High School for Boys and lecturer in Performing Arts at South Essex College. Currently Roger teaches part time at the Westcliff High Schools. In addition to conducting the Southend Bach Choir, Roger is musical director of Southend Choral Society and Director of Music at Holy Trinity Church, Southchurch, with whom he has taken the choir to many cathedrals across the UK. Roger is the founder and Musical Director of Southend Girls' Choir and Director of Southend Boys' *Choir*, positions he has held for over 30 years. Roger has taken these choirs on many overseas concert tours to Poland, Belgium, France, Holland, Italy, Spain, Canada, US, Singapore, Hong Kong, Australia and Seychelles. These tours have included performances in The Sydney Opera House, Queensland Performing Arts Centre. Cathedrals in Paris, New York, Chicago, Washington, Milan, The Seychelles, Florence, St Peter's Basilica, Rome, St Mark's, Venice and many other major venues and concert halls across Europe, Canada, US, Singapore, and Australia. Roger has conducted the choirs in major London concert halls, including Royal Festival Hall and Barbican, and prepared the choirs for many performances at the BBC Proms. Roger directed performances of Britten's "Nove's Fludde" during the centenary year of Britten's birth, involving over 450 musicians of all ages performing in Southend, Tilbury Cruise Terminal and Southwark Cathedral. For several years Roger was Musical Director of the Seychelles Festival of Music.

Southend Concert Orchestra

Leader - Jo Stephens

Tonight's orchestra consists of some of the finest musicians from Southend and surrounding areas. The players largely work as orchestral musicians and teachers across the region. The orchestra was formed to accompany choirs and choral societies, and has performed many major choral works, including Bach's "St Matthew Passion", Verdi's "Requiem", Handel's "Messiah", Bach's "Mass in B minor" and Mozart's "Requiem". The orchestra has performed widely across Southend and in venues such as Brentwood Cathedral and St Paul's Church, Covent Garden.

Bach's Mass in B minor

Johann Sebastian Bach's "Mass in B Minor" stands as one of the greatest masterpieces of choral music, a monumental work that showcases his profound musical and spiritual depth. Composed over many years and completed in 1749, just a year before his death, this setting of the Latin Mass represents the culmination of Bach's lifelong mastery of counterpoint, harmony, and orchestration.

Unlike his other sacred works, which were written for specific liturgical occasions, the *Mass in B Minor* is an expansive and universal expression of faith, blending intricate fugues, soaring arias, and grand choral movements. It is divided into five sections—*Kyrie, Gloria, Credo, Sanctus, and Agnus Dei*—each rich in contrast, color, and emotional depth.

Although Bach never heard the full work performed in his lifetime, the "Mass in B Minor" gained recognition in the 19th century and has since been celebrated as one of the greatest achievements in Western music. From the deeply moving *Crucifixus* to the jubilant *Dona nobis pacem*, this extraordinary work continues to inspire audiences with its blend of intellectual rigor and profound devotion.
